Purpose of the role

Provide clinical leadership and speciality psychiatry services to CYMHS and to contribute to the overall development and quality of an integrated and recovery orientated Mental Health Service.

Context and Delegations

- This role reports directly to the Clinical Director MNMH-RedCab.
- This role has a professional reporting line to the Director Medical Services, MNMH.
- This role will work directly with a multidisciplinary team.
- This role will work directly with clinical and non-clinical staff across MNMH.
- There are no finance and Human resources delegations

Headspace

Under Better Care Together, and consistent with the Bilateral Schedule on Mental Health and Suicide Prevention: Queensland, the Queensland Government has committed to support the employment of dedicated, specialist Mental Health, Alcohol and Other Drugs (MHAOD) Clinicians by Metro North Health to provide consultation liaison and clinical in-reach services to all Headspace centres in Queensland. In support and partnership with Headspace, the role of state funded MHAOD services is to provide a seamless service experience for adolescents and young people (12-25 years) with MHAOD needs referred to Headspace Services, consistent with a no wrong door policy and providing the right service at the right time.

This initiative will support a more integrated service system that bridges gaps in care, reduces the missing middle, provides more timely access to specialist mental health treatment and care and strengths clinical pathways (referrals and transitions). A seamless consumer experience will be achieved by the MHAOD CL staff working across the historical (age related) service boundary between *Headspace*, child and youth mental health services and adult mental health services and whenever possible being physically co-located with *Headspace* Services.

The enhanced clinical service provision across 5 *Headspace* Centres will increase access and boost integration to multidisciplinary adolescent youth mental health services by providing advice, on-site specialist care and treatment and streamline transition of care between *Headspace* and Queensland's state-funded MHAOD services for adolescents and young people aged 12-25 years primarily across Metro North Health, this may include other Health Services as required.

Adolescents and young people aged 12-25 years (and their families/carers) referred to *Headspace* with MHAOD needs who would likely:

- benefit from additional specialist, multidisciplinary MHAOD consultation and liaison support within the Headspace model of care, or clinical assessment, treatment and care for more serious and complex MHAOD needs which cannot be met by the current Headspace model
- benefit from supported referral and transition to further/ongoing health treatment and care within Metro North Health

Key Accountabilities

This successful applicant will carry out the following key accountabilities in accordance with the Metro North Health's values:

- Provide assessment and treatment to consumers with mental disorders within Metro North Mental Health facilities.
- The Staff Psychiatrist may have primary responsibility with a specific service team and will be flexible to provide support to assist with leave cover.
- Assist the relevant Director and other senior staff in planning and implementing policy for the development of child and adolescent mental health services in the Hospital Health Service.
- Provide high quality specialist clinical leadership and oversight to the multidisciplinary team.
- Collaborate with the Director and service staff to promote and ensure that efficient, effective services are delivered in a timely manner.
- Provide clinical support advice and supervision of professional staff including registrars, nurses, and allied health
- Participate in an after-hours on-call roster.
- Provide written reports as requested.
- Facilitate approved research, and conduct research, evaluation, and quality improvement.
- Design, implement, collaborate in/or facilitate approved educational programs for trainees, staff, and other agencies when appropriate.
- Provide ethical decision making in the achievement of organisational goals.
- Staff are expected to be compliant with the timely and accurate input and collection of consumer related demographic information, diagnosis, outcomes collections and provision of service activity into appropriate applications. The data and information include the electronic entry and completion of documentation to meet legislative requirements, including *Mental Health Act 2016* documentation, admissions, discharges, and transfers.

Clinical Practice:

- Provision of specialist psychiatry services to headspace that includes a consultation-liaison and clinical in-reach model which supports the capacity of staff in headspace (i.e. resourced to respond to mild-moderate MHAOD issues), and to assess and respond to adolescents, young people and their families with more complex MHAOD presentations. This includes:
 - Engage in enhanced psychiatric consultation and liaison services and second opinions of adolescents and young people referred by the *headspace* centres.
 - Availability to conduct psychiatric assessments of adolescents and young people consistent with Comprehensive Care requirements.
 - Manage medication regimes and review physical observations of adolescents and young people in conjunction with the adolescent's or young person's MHAOD clinician, regular GP and/or other treating clinicians or specialists.

- Actively support the early identification and streamlined referrals between the *headspace* centres and Queensland Health MHAOD services for adolescents and young people requiring a 'step up' or 'step down' in clinical care, including the transitions of care of adolescents and young people across HHS boundaries when required.
- Apply professional clinical evidence that supports continuous improvement of local service delivery.
- Supporting and building the capacity and competency of headspace staff to respond to more complex MHAOD needs.
- Contribute to the development of clinical practice procedures and protocols as required.
- Regular attendance at Medical Education and quality meetings, including Mortality & Morbidity and Peer Review Meetings.

Supervision, education and training

- Foster an environment of education, quality improvement, evidence-based practice and reflective feedback and learning.
- Provide expert/specialised education, consultation, and training for the multidisciplinary teams across the 5 headspace centres located within the Metro North Mental Health catchment.
- Provide regular oversight and teaching to medical and other professional staff within the team and deliver education through training seminars and tutorials to other clinical staff.
- Participate in the induction, training, and professional development of all medical staff within the team.
- Participate in the Junior Medical and International Graduate Training Programs as per the standards set out by the RANZCP and other approved organisations, including weekly supervision of registrars / Principle House Officers (PHOs). Regular attendance at Medical Education and quality meetings, including Mortality and Morbidity, and Peer Review Meetings.
- Set the tone and standards to support optimal clinical placements for medical students to achieve their educational objectives

Communication / Team Participation

- Liaison with treating headspace and MHAOD clinicians, GP's, specialists, hospitals, private practice practitioners and community case managers of adolescents and young people referred by the headspace centres.
- Provide expert advice/consultation and work collaboratively with treating headspace and MHAOD clinicians to provide multi-disciplinary assessment and intervention for adolescents and young people and their families/carers.
- Provide specialist psychiatry knowledge and skill into team training and continuing professional development activities
 to contribute to the knowledge and skills of the multi-disciplinary teams across the headspace centres.
- Develop, implement, and evaluate within headspace quality activities in clinical management and mental health practice to continually improve the care of adolescents and young people and their families/carers accessing the service

Staff are expected to possess knowledge of, or have the ability to acquire knowledge of, relevant applications including:

About Metro North Mental Health

Metro North Mental Health (MNMH) provides mental health and alcohol and other drug services that support people who have severe and complex needs or are in crisis. The service supports the recovery of people with mental illness through the provision of recovery focused services and consumer and carer services in collaboration with primary and private health providers and Non-Government partners.

Care is delivered to people of all ages in the community, in the hospital and in specialist residential settings. The services for people experiencing mental illness include a range of specialist assessment, treatment, rehabilitation and recovery services that also consist of emergency, consultation liaison, forensic, substance use disorders, eating disorders, community mental health and inner-city homeless services.

For people experiencing substance use disorders, MNMH provides access to evidence-based treatments including opioid maintenance, substance withdrawal management, and counselling. For people experiencing substance misuse issues, there are a range of harm minimisation and brief intervention services.

How you will be assessed

You will be assessed on your ability to demonstrate the following values within the context of the 'Key Accountabilities'. The ideal applicant will be able to demonstrate the following:

Mandatory qualifications/professional registration/other requirements

- The successful applicant must have Scope of Clinical Practice (SoCP) awarded by a Metro North Health Credentialing and SoCP Committee appropriate to the role. Information presented for application may be presented to the Committee during the selection process and all appointments are subject to maintenance of SoCP within the Clinical Skills Capability Framework for the facility in which the clinical work is to be undertaken. This process must be completed prior to commencement.
- Appointment to this role requires proof of qualification and specialist registration or eligibility for specialist registration in Psychiatry with the Medical Board of Australia. Candidates who have completed all assessment tasks for completion of their specialist registration with only time left in training to complete can also be considered.
- Fellowship of the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatry53. However, applicants who have a
 reasonable expectation of fellowship by the end of the calendar year are also encouraged to apply (noting the
 above registration requirements).
- Certificate of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry from RANZCP, or a desire to complete the certificate.
- Certified copies of your qualifications are required to be provided with your application.
- A University appointment would be highly desirable.
- While not mandatory, a research degree and / or post graduate doctorate (PhD) would be desirable.
- It is a condition of employment for this role for the employee to be, and remain, vaccinated against the following vaccine preventable diseases during their employment (Health Employment Directive No. 01/16):
 - Measles, mumps, rubella (MMR)
 - Varicella (chicken pox)
 - Pertussis (whooping cough)
 - Hepatitis B
 - Tuberculosis

- All staff appointed to the Metro North Mental Health service may be required to work across practice settings and/or participate in shift work providing extended services. Clinical movement across other similar positions in the mental health service is a service-wide expectation and is actively supported.
- All staff appointed to MNMH may be required to work across practice settings and/or participate in shift work providing extended services.
- Timely completion of RANZCP Supervisor training.
- MBBS or equivalent qualification registrable with the Australian Health Practitioner Registration Authority (APHRA), Medical Board of Australia.
- This position is required to work all shifts in accordance with the unit roster and participate in the "on call" after hour's roster.
- Appointment as an Authorised Mental Health Practitioner (AMHP) under the Mental Health Act 2016 is highly
 desirable. If not an AMHP, then willingness to undertake and complete the requirements for the appointment.
- The incumbent is required to operate a motor vehicle. As driving may be a significant task in the delivery of this position's objectives, proof of a current 'C' Class licence must be provided.
- Computer literacy skills.
- **Disclosure of Serious Disciplinary History:** Under the Public Sector Act 2022, applicants are required to disclose any previous serious disciplinary action taken against them.

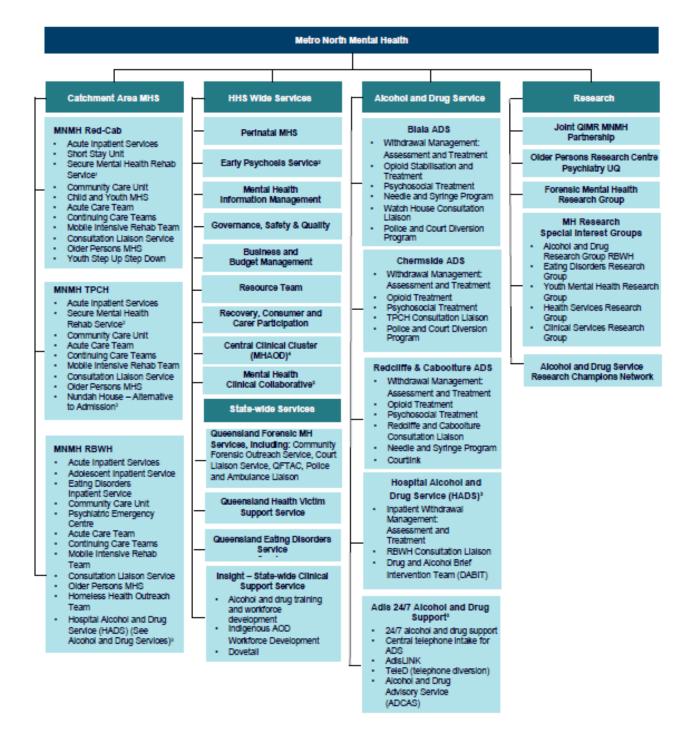

All new employees who will be working in clinical areas must be assessed for their risk of tuberculosis and screening undertaken if required.

Existing staff that are engaged prior to 1 July 2016 are **not subject** to this condition of employment unless they apply for a role with VPD requirements that is with a different Queensland Health entity (i.e. one Health Service to another Health Service, Department of Health (DoH) to a Health Service, or Health Service to DoH).

Additional Information

- Applications will remain current for 12 months or for the duration of the vacancy.
- Future vacancies of a temporary, full time and part time nature may also be filled through this recruitment process.
- Health Care Workers in Queensland Health whose occupation poses a potential risk of exposure to blood or body fluids must be immunised against Hepatitis B according to the National Health and Medical Research Council Australian Immunisation Handbook and the Queensland Health Infection Control Guidelines.
- Pre-employment screening, including criminal history and discipline history checks, may be undertaken on persons recommended for employment. Roles providing health, counselling and support services mainly to children will require a Blue Card, unless otherwise exempt.
