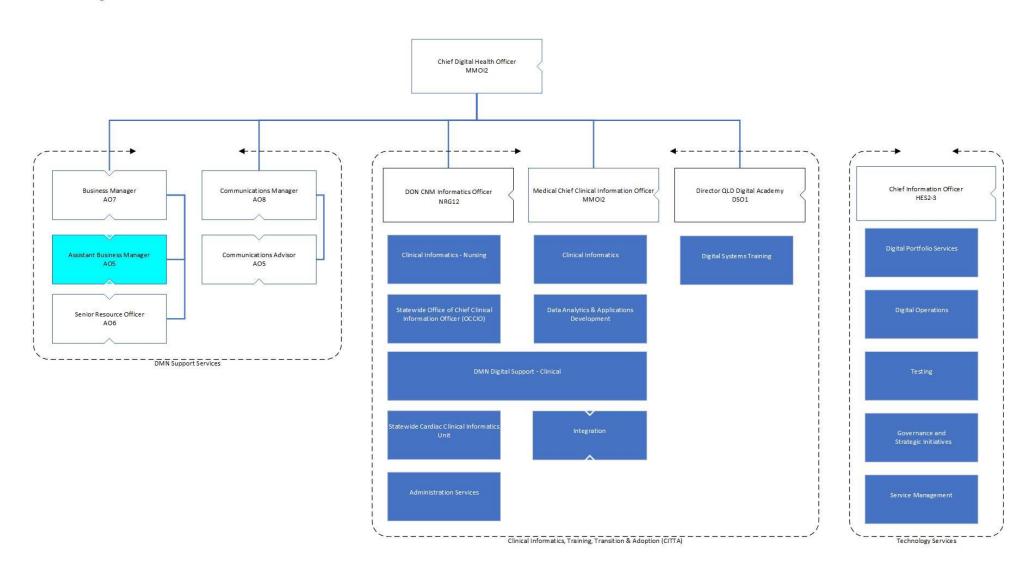
Metro North Health Values and their corresponding Lominger™ competencies:
