Your Opportunity

This position is accredited for 6 months non-core advanced training in general paediatrics with the Royal Australasian College of Physicians.

This is a seconded education role 0.5 FTE with the University of Queensland (UQ) for an Advanced Trainee in General Paediatrics.

The position of Paediatric Registrar (in the role of Paediatric Advanced Trainee Fellow) will:

 Work as an active member of the University of Queensland- Children's Health Queensland Clinical Unit (CHQ-CU) under the direction of the Clinical Unit Head and as detailed below. A specific focus of this role is to support the UQ CHQ-CU in the transitional phase from the current to the new MD program.

You will fulfil the accountabilities of this role in accordance with the CHQ HHS core values and as outlined below.

Generic Responsibilities

- Undertake regular assessment and performance reviews, actively participate in unit and facility based educational programs and meet mandatory training requirements.
- Role model professionalism with respect to confidentiality, patient dignity, effective communication at primary patient care level and with staff, and the completion/maintenance of accurate and comprehensive medical records.
- Actively participate in teaching and supervision of Medical Students. Undertake skills-based training to support this role.
- Contribute to a positive organisational culture, role model appropriate behaviour in accordance with the Code of Conduct for the Queensland Public Service and provide Senior Registrar representation on hospital committees.

Specific Responsibilities

- Actively participate in a working environment supporting quality human resources management practices including employment equity, anti-discrimination, work, health and safety, and ethical behaviour.
- Develop a positive culture within division which encourages and recognises high performance, builds leadership capabilities and supports staff to maximise their health and wellbeing.

UQ Medical Student Responsibilities

- Work collaboratively with the Head UQ Children's Health Queensland Clinical Unit, Principal Specialty Supervisor, Specialty Supervisor, Team Leader, Student Coordinators and other Medical Education Fellows to address matters relating to the facilitation and delivery of medical student education and training at the Queensland Children's Hospital (QCH) and any affiliated Children's Health Queensland sites.
- Assist with orientation of students to the Hospital and their clinical placement Departments
- Participation in and assisting organisation (recruitment, orientation) and evaluation of the clinical bedside teaching program; Engage hospital clinicians in the supervision and teaching of medical students
- Delivery of a number of the paediatric online interactive education (POLIE) tutorials / case-based discussions
- Assisting with work-based assessments
- Assisting with the provision of pastoral care, academic support and mentoring of students
- Assist with the development of educational resources, with a focus on the delivery of the new MD program in the CHQ-CU in 2025
- Assisting in the facilitation of the CHQ Interprofessional Student Workshops

 Assist in other UQ activities, as directed by the Head, CHQ-CU, for example Assessment of medical students including the Structured Clinical Examination (SCE) / Vivas, in addition to reviewing and updating multiple choice questions.

Administrative Responsibilities

- Representation on relevant organisational committees ensuring accurate representation of issues and accurate and timely dissemination of information.
- Lead and deliver an agreed organisational project in the area of Medical Education

Educational and Professional Development

- Participate as part of a team by adopting attitudes consistent with a team approach to the management of disability and exhibit the social and ethical behaviours required of a senior staff member.
- It is intended that the Fellow will both maximise their own professional development with a view to completing their specialist training.
- Actively participate in UQ-CHQ Journal Club and other learning activities to maximise scholarship in Medical Education.

Research

- Develop the skills of critical evaluation of published research and the ability to design research projects by participating in all professional development activities.

Qualifications/Professional Registration/Other Requirements

- MBBS or equivalent level medical qualification that is recognised by the Medical Board of Australia.
- Current registration with/or eligible for registration with the Medical Board of Australia through the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (Ahpra) as a medical practitioner.
- Applicants must be an advanced trainee in General Paediatrics with the Royal Australasian College of Physicians (successfully passed both the written and clinical components of the examination) or hold equivalent experience/qualifications.

How will you be assessed?

- Commitment to medical education, integration of best practice and promoting a culture of learning.
- Ability to apply adult education principles to the delivery of education and training.
- Proven ability to function as a team member within a multidisciplinary team, through the use of welldeveloped professional communication, interpersonal and negotiation skills.
- Demonstrated commitment to patient safety, quality improvement, clinical risk management, and evidencebased practice and research for improving performance including experience in clinical research.
- Demonstrated commitment to professional development of self and others including ability to provide clinical teaching, supervision and/or mentoring to other professional staff and students.
- Proven ability to contribute to change and implementation processes.
