THROUGH PATIENTS' EYES

A new Hervey Bay Hospital Emergency Department was opened in January 2019 and sees slightly under 50000 presentations/year. We are a Tier 2, paediatric logbook accredited department, and provisionally accredited for TS4 trainees. We have a cohesive and friendly group of 20.75 FTE FACEMs, who are enthusiastic about regional and rural emergency work. There is FACEM cover for 16 hours a day with on call overnight. Many of our FACEM cohort are heavily involved in ACEM activities, including examinations and other college committees, and are passionate in ensuring the equity of both training and service provision in a regional area.

Trainees should consider that with a relatively junior cohort and lower trainee numbers there is ample opportunity to be involved in procedures as well as have easy access to completion of workplace-based assessments. Trainees also may have access to rotations such as anaesthetics, paediatrics, medicine, intensive care and USS (undergoing accreditation in 2025 for 2026 start). PEM trainees should consider that the paediatric term would fulfil general paediatric requirements and covers the full spectrum of paediatric presentations, including neonatal resuscitations and managing children pre-transfer to a tertiary centre.

The department has an excellent record of success at Primary and Fellowship examinations. The education sessions are reviewed regularly and tailored to match the needs and training stage of each cohort (rather than a one size fits all approach that has been designed years in advance). All stages of trainees are involved in quality improvement portfolios for which dedicated clinical support time is allocated in TS4.
