

Rural and Remote Professional Learning Grant – Master of Education 2026

Degree List

The **Professional Learning Grant** supports eligible teachers and school leaders in a transfer rating 4–7 school location to complete post-graduate qualifications. The grant provides up to \$10,000 each year towards tuition fees.

To be eligible for the Rural and Remote Professional Learning Grant (grant), candidates must undertake a **Master of Education** (or similar) degree at an Australian higher education institution. If the degree isn't listed below, email the weblinks of the degree/s to the Scholarships and Grants team at scholarships@qed.qld.gov.au and eligibility can be confirmed.
